When some Al-Anon members are in a hurry to get to the topic and want to skip the Welcome, 1 m the one who always insists it be read.

Why? Because it reminds me what the program is all about, and

now I'm glad it has such lines as----

"Al-Anon is an anonymous fellowship, and everything that is said here, in the group meeting, and member-to-member, must be held in confidence."

Then in the Glosing is this line ----

"Talk to each other, reason things out with someone else, but

let there be no gossip or Criticism of one another."

You have read and heard these lines dozens of times, I know, but are we all remembering and practicing them? Or are you having a slip occassionaly and gossip is slipping out of your mouth before you stop and think before you speak?

The one purpose of Al-Anon is to help families of Alcoholics, we practice the Twelve Steps of AA ourselves, by encouraging and understanding relatives, and by welcoming and giving comfort to

families of alcoholics.

But by gossiping about these families of alcoholics, we sure aren't following group purposes and principles. How can we give people confidence in Al-Anon if their stories are repeated and elaborated upon? We are defeating the very purpose for which we are joined together.

DISTRICT III LITERATURE CENTER

The more I become involved in the Literature Center the more intriguing it becomes. The therapy is also wonderful for me. It certainly keeps me on my toes and I have become more than ever involved in Al-Anon.

Though this Literature Center began in August 1975, I really didn't start keeping a correct and accurate account of sales until January 1976. And now each book and pamphlet is recorded under it's respective title. Each penny, nickel, dollar bill and check is dutifully recorded. I just never dreamed that this offer to have this service for the benefit of the groups of a quicker access for literature, instead of the usual three weeks wait, would mushroom.

sales were tripled in January 1977 over those sales of the previous January; and February is only half over and I have sold double the

amount over last February.

As I reported at the Jan. District meeting, the "One Day At A Time" book sells the most. How many of the members have read "Living With an Alcoholic?" This book was the first one put out by the Al-Anon Family Groups. It is informative, structural and every group should have one for the use to all members to read when they lead meetings. Also in this book is a short analysis of each Step and Tradition, also the Slogans.

The pamphlet that sold best was Alcoholism-A merry-Go-Round.
The pamphlet "Sponsorship" came in last. Only 15 of these were purchased during the year and I bought 7 of those from the Center because I led a meeting one night on Sponsorship and I gave each person

present a pamphlet to keep for re-reading.

The literature is very important to our fellowship. Much of it was written by Lois W. She is well steeped in the philosophy of the program and each time I read and re-read a piece of literature I acquire something new from it. Using these pamphlets and books in meetings is a great asset, because everyone does not get the same meaning out of a group of words. Try it sometime, it makes for some interesting discussions.

Sometimes I believe we overload and overwhelm the newcomer with literature. We have a tendency to want to give them a copy of everything available because it helped us so much, but how frightning that can be when you start to read about all these things at once about

changing ourselves.
