#### **What is Idaho Area 13?**

So how is Al-Anon organized? These seven districts make up Idaho Here's a breakdown of the structure of this program for families and friends of alcoholics. Al-Anon meetings are held in seven districts across Idaho. These districts encompass all of the Gem State and even some out-of-state communities that border Idaho such as Clarkston (WA), Ontario (OR), and Afton (WY).

# What Is Al-Anon and Alateen?

"Al-Anon is a mutual support program for people whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. By sharing common experiences and applying the Al-Anon principles, families and friends of alcoholics can bring positive changes to their individual situations, whether or not the alcoholic admits the existence of a drinking problem or seeks help.

Alateen, a part of the Al-Anon Family Groups, is a fellowship of young people (mostly teenagers) whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking whether they are in your life drinking or not. By attending Alateen, teenagers meet other teenagers with similar situations. Alateen is not a religious program and there are no fees or dues to belong to it."


